Timeline and Method

- 1) 2008 Financial collapse; Protests in the streets, pots and pans
- 2) 2009 New election; Change of government
- 3) 2010 National Forum; Constituent Assembly election, 25 seats
- 4) 2011 Constituent Assembly at work for four months, passed bill 25:0
- 5) 2012 National Referendum, bill approved 67% against 33%
- 6) 2013 Parliament failed to ratify bill; Old rascals back to office
- 7) 2016 Panama Papers scandal featuring three Icelandic ministers
- 8) 2019 Bribery scandal in Namibia; Renewed protests in the streets
- 9) Bill still held hostage by Parliament, which plays with fire
